

#### A brief word about us




# Our nonprofit in brief

- Oakland Landscape Committee established in 1991, following the Oakland Hills Firestorm, to create and maintain public and school gardens in Oakland, CA. The Oakland Parks & Recreation Foundation served as our 501c3 fiscal agent.
- Over the years, we created a dozen school gardens and four public gardens.

### Firestorm Memorial Garden



# Created in 1993 for inspiration as firestorm survivors rebuilt the neighborhood

- Now an iconic landmark at the entrance of Hiller Highlands, center of the 1991 Oakland Hills Firestorm where 3,500 people lost their homes and 25 people died.
- Built on ½ acre of Caltrans property at entrance to the neighborhood
- Maintained by volunteers
- Irrigation water supplied by adjacent private school

# Gateway Emergency Preparedness Exhibit Center & Fire-Resistant Demonstration Garden

# Created in 2003 on City of Oakland property.

- Raised \$500,000 for funding and donated materials for construction.
- Scenic overlook designed pro-bono by architect who also lost home in 1991.
- Fire Resistant Demonstration
   Garden added in 2017 with
   succulents and other appropriate
   plants to showcase landscaping for
   defensible space.



### The Green PLANeT Gardens: Our new Veggie Garden

- 10 3x3x10 foot raised beds
- 21 4x4-foot grow trays
- 7 fruit trees
- 8-foot-tall deer fencing
- Drip irrigation
- Gravel pathways



### Coming in 2023: New Cut Flower Bed



- Replaced two aged, diseased pine trees
- Planted 9 peonies and 9 lillies
- Put in 15 bare root roses donated by Weeks Roses,
- Starting from seed Zinnias, Delphinium, Stock,
   Foxglove and other flowers
- Will plant lavender around the borders to deter deer

### Coming Soon: Green PLANeTDisplay Garden

- ½ acre of south end of pasture
- Need to develop and implement design
- Add drip irrigation
- Install specimen plants from one or more nurseries
- Surround with 8 foot tall deer fence



### Lessons Learned:

### 1. Avoid paying retail for materials

#### Seek in-kind donations

- Free wood chips from local tree companies.
- Free donated plants from nurseries
- Free donations from local plant societies
- Free soil, plants, gravel other items off of Craigslist, Next Door, etc. Use wanted section with a photo of preferred donations)
- Cuttings of favorite flowers from neighbors' gardens.
- Dumpsters from local waste management resources

Keep in mind: you will need to do your own hauling!



#### Seek heavily discounted items

- Go for broken bags of mulch and marked down plants past their prime at Home Depot, Lowes, etc.
- Marked down plants from local retail and wholesale nurseries.



#### Grow your own starters

- Buy plant plugs from online auctions on EBay and grow in home nursery for later planting: Knox Nursery—30-250 plants for \$9.99 + shipping.
- Some nurseries will sell liners—ask for a discount
- Grow seeds in grow trays or vertical light systems with growing trays for use indoors
- Convert a portion of your home, garage or shop as a year-round location for starting plants



Purchase Wholesale- Emerald Coast Nursery & others here in Oregon

Search for free or inexpensive plants from private sellers or nurseries advertising online. Free section on Craigslist and Next Door. Estate and garage sales— wait to the end sellers will take a low offer or give items away for frees

Community College Plant Sales—often offer plant plugs at \$1 or less.

Boy Scout plant sales

End of Season Sales at Retailers

Join another garden club—they have door prize drawings, auctions and plant sales.

An excellent way to get plants for pennies on the dollar!

# Lessons Learned: Managing your tools

- Arrange for sufficient tools
- OR
- Local tool lending libraries
  - Green Lents Community Tools

- Commercial tool rental sites
  - Home Depot \*
  - United Rentals, Clackamas
  - Johnson Creek Rental, Portland
  - Pioneer Rental, Oregon City
  - C & E Rentals, Inc, Tualatin
  - Barbur Blvd. Rentals, Portland
  - YardRents, Portland
- Encourage volunteers to bring their own gloves and tools.

- Establish your own cache
  - Accessible storage
  - Fund through grants
    - Home Depot Store Managers can approve up to \$1000 in donations for tools and supplies
    - Also can partner with their employees under Team Depot as a project
  - Pick up at garage & estate sales, swap meets.
  - Search on –line- try to avoid paying retail.
  - Be sure to carefully mark your own tools to differentiate from borrowed tools.

Always count your tools before and after the project so that you return the right tools, if they are borrowed, and maintain control over your own tools after the event.

### **Best Practice for Volunteer Teams**

- 1. Assign a supervisor.
- 2. Appoint a safety coordinator--reminds volunteers to take hydration breaks and keeps track of tools.
- 3. Orient volunteers to the work plan and tool safety.
- 4. Assign one or two volunteers as gofors—removing green waste to the common dump spot.

- Schedule workdays on known "green" event days:
  - Martin Luther King Day of Service— January
  - Earth Day--April
  - Arbor Week- April
  - Wildfire Prevention Day-May



## Marketing Tips

- Develop a brochure /flyer for your organization that people can take home with them
- Hand out business cards so they won't forget
- Develop a website and use social media to get the word out
- Set up a sign board with your organization's name to publicize the workday


#### **North Hills Gardens**

Oakland's North Hills community is nome to two unique treasures – the Firestorm Memorial Garden and the Gateway Emergency Preparedness Exhibit Center and Garden. Situated near the intersections of Hiller Drive and Tunnel Road in North Oakland, these lovely public spaces offer lasting tribute to the thousands of residents who lost their homes in the 1991 Oakland Hills Firestorm, and to the 25 people who perished that fateful October day. The Gardens serve as ever-present reminders about the need for personal and community emergency preparedness, and for effective, attentive vegetation management on public and private lands.

The Gardens exist today largely thanks to the efforts of the Oakland Landscape Committee (OLC) and its founder and chair. Gordon Piper. For decades, Mr. Piper has trelessly led the way, organizing teams of volunteers to enhance and maintain these and other North Oakland green spaces, soliciting donations of money, plants and materials from local businesses, and bringing in professional help when needed. Oakland residents owe him a huge debt of gratitude.

In January 2018, the North Hills Community Association took over responsibility for the care and preservation of the Gardens, carrying on in the tradition of the OLC. Please help the NHCA sustain these neighborhood gens, either by volunteering a few hours with landscape maintenance, or by donating funds for monitoring, irrigation, plants, tools and other supplies.



## **Fund Raising**

- Take a letter and walk around the neighborhood near the site
- Use personal Christmas Card List
- Send out solicitation on local listservs, if permitted
- Send out solicitation to previous volunteers
- Seek out grants from
  - Service clubs
  - Online review of potential grants from local foundations, corporations, etc.



- Fund Raising Pitch
  - Share what you have accomplished in the past
  - Share goals for the future
  - Include a remit envelope and/or instructions for sending checks
  - Sign up with Paypal for online donations on your website

# Fund Raising isn't just about real dollars...

- Nurseries might be throwing items out at the end of the season or going out of business,
- Ask for free wood chips and other materials.
- Look for used materials on Craigslist or NextDoor— ask if seller would consider donating.

Sometimes it takes more than one request---- reach out to multiple stores or ask one store several times.

### Lessons Learned: How to manage volunteers

#### Plan the work

- Confirm schedule with volunteers and finalize # of volunteers.
- Provide instructions: Typically, wear long pants, long sleeves, sturdy shoes, a hat, bring own gloves, sunscreen and water, and mask, if necessary.
- Have volunteers sign in with name phone and email address, sign waivers, and follow up afterwards. (Set up a data base for future use)
- Break up projects into segments that teams of up to 5 can work on.



- Break up projects into segments that teams of up to 5 can work on.
- Assign a team supervisor from your group to supervise each team.
- Engage with volunteers during the workday— explain purpose of the project, answer questions.
- Write a thank you after the event and try to engage them to come again in the future
